### Bring what's blooming in your gardens to share

## MAINTENANCe

Even though it's already March, Don Wallace of Singing Tree Gardens Nursery says it's not too late to give your plants a final feeding for big, colorful trusses. Use slow release fertilizer: 1 handful for plants around 3 ft high & 2 handfuls for plants 5-6 ft high scattered 6 inches from truck & watered-in should do it. Use food with high "P" number in NPK formula. And let the blooming begin!
