Do's and Don'ts for this month: Do keep watering until the rains come. **Do transplant. Don't prune (unless you want to cut off the buds that have been growing since early summer).** Don Wallace of Singing Tree Gardens suggests starting to feed your plants, if you haven't yet, with a high phosphorus fertilizer for bigger and more colorful blooms.
