MAINTENANCE

It's still hot, so don't forget to water, preferably in the mornings. Howard Oliver always misted his plants in the afternoon during hot weather, however a misting of the foliage in the afternoon might not be a good idea since the sun is setting sooner and mold & fungus growth may become more prevalent on wet leaves and stems. Thrips are in full force at this time of year. Christy Hartsell highly recommends Bayer Rose & Flower Care. Because it's granular, it's easy to apply around the base of plants so at least you are not spraying pesticide into the air (and your lungs).

Anything wonderful blooming in your gardens? All I have is a duranta erecta shrub (small deep purple flowers with white picotee) and purple Mexican sage, the tuberous begonias and nerines are just about finished. Next month the sasanquas start and after that, the early blooming rhodies, — and the garden is exciting again.
