MAINTENANCE

Another great tip from Don Wallace, owner of Singing Tree Nursery & periodic speaker at our meetings: "I often hear "To insure good drainage, I always add broken pottery or rocks and gravel at the bottom of my pot when transplanting". This technique can be found online, but it is incorrect. Adding rocks or gravel or broken pottery will make the drainage worse. As shown in the illustration below, the gravel at the bottom will make the volume of potting soil, less and push the wettest soil up around the roots. This can result in root rot and plant loss. It is better to make your soil mix well drained with the addition of bark, sand and pearlite and keep it consistent from top to bottom in the pot."
